BSSC LEARN TO SWIM JOB VACANCIES

Did you know that many of our teenage swimmers are working each week at our Learn to Swim school?







Our LTS school currently runs at the College pool on Fridays at 5.15-6.15pm and Sundays 3-6pm and we are always in need of additional staff.

Pool helpers: are in the water with the children during their lessons, helping them follow the directions being given by our fully qualified instructors. To be a pool helper you must be over 14 years old and have an interest in helping children who are at the earliest stages of learning how to swim.


Instructors: many of our current instructors are swimmers who started out as pool helpers. Once a helper is 16, they can attend the courses run by Swim England and the Institute of Swimming to first become a Level 1 Assistant Swim Teacher and then a fully qualified Level 2 Swim Teacher. They are intensive and quite costly courses, but once qualified, they will have a skill for life that they can use where ever they are.


Lifeguards: to be a lifeguard you must be over 16 years old and have completed the Royal Life Saving Society's (RLSS) National Pool Lifeguard Qualification (NPLQ). The NPLQ has a cost involved but like teaching, is recognised at pools nationally.

Did you know that lots of information about our club can be found on our website? We've been going through a process of updating the content and reorganising it so it's more friendly for our members.








The **Members** menu is a great place to start with links to Swim Manager, helpful guides, and lots of information on club kit, our committee and all our club policies.



The **Events** menu leads you to our calendar and provides lots of information on upcoming Open Meets and galas that we plan to attend.






The **News** menu contains all our website articles, our newsletter archive (Babble) and links to every local newspaper article published about our club (In the News).

Best swim hack: Hum whilst doing a tumble turn



SWIM ENGLAND HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first rung in the Swim England competition ladder are County Championships and this season we had 39 BSSC swimmers qualify to compete against the best in Hertfordshire. For three weekends in January and February our individual qualifiers and relay teams headed to The Venue in Borehamwood and returned with lots of fantastic achievements including 43 age group medals (10 Gold, 17 Silver, 16 Bronze), 16 Championship medals (5 Gold, 4 Silver, 7 Bronze), 7 Junior Championship medals (3 Gold, 1 Silver, 3 Bronze), 5 relay medals (3 Gold, 2 Bronze), 2 top girl awards (1 1st, 1 3rd) and one County Best Time. BRITISH SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The British Swimming Championships is the most prestigious British swimming meet of each season and always promises some exciting racing with the fastest swimmers in Britain, including members of the Team GB squad, competing across six days of action at Sheffield's Ponds Forge pool. Qualification is tough with a single set of consideration times for each sex, but outstanding long course (50m) swims at Level 1 meets during 2022 and early 2023 secured spots for five BSSC members to compete in April 2023.

With qualification based on meeting a single entry time for each event irrespective of age (shown left in case you are interested!), the under 18 trio of Ella Greatbatch (15 years), Kirsty Neill (16 years) and Callum Cox (17 years) gave outstanding performances in the run up to the Championships. Congratulations also goes to our two over 18 year old swimmers Lucy Wheeler and Niamh James.

Unfortunately, although they achieved the consideration times, both Kirsty Neill and Niamh James were unable to compete this year so we had three competitors to look out for and cheer on:

- Ella Greatbatch (15 yrs) 200m Breaststroke
- Callum Cox (17 yrs) 50m Butterfly
- Lucy Wheeler (18 Over) 100m Freestyle

All three BSSC swimmers swum superbly against the top swimmers in the Country, getting close to personal best times and ranking among the top in their age groups. Callum Cox reached the Junior Final of the Mens 50m Butterfly, coming 8th in a time of 25.95 seconds. He was also the 3rd fastest 17 year old. Ella Greatbatch was the 5th fastest 15 year old in Britain with her 200m Breaststroke time of 2:43.02 (64th position overall), whilst Lucy Wheeler was 57th overall in the 100m Freestyle (58.89).



Since competing at the British Championships Callum Cox has moved to the Mount Kelly School in Tavistock, Devon. We wish him well for the future.

After the British Championships were held, focus for our older competitive swimmers turned to the Swim England East Region Championships (see next page) and also qualification for the British and English Summer Championships (also in this newsletter).

SWIM ENGLAND EAST REGION LONG COURSE CHAMPS

During three weekends in April/May each year, the top swimmers from the six eastern Counties of England – Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Essex, Hertfordshire, Norfolk, Suffolk – come together at the Swim England East Region Long Course (50m) Championships. Qualifying times for each event and sex for six age groups (11/12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17/Over) are published at the start of the year and swimmers must obtain the times in the specified window at a Level 1, 2 or 3 licenced meet.

Twenty two BSSC swimmers qualified this year and they all stepped up to the challenge of the occasion, ensuring BSSC finished 20th out of 39 clubs and was the 3rd ranked Hertfordshire club behind Hatfield and Watford. Individually the swimmers secured many personal bests, had 25 top eight finishes and also brought home ten medals:

- 14 years: Dylan Davenport Bronze 50m/100m Freestyle
- 15 years: Ella Greatbatch Silver 50m/100m/200m Breaststroke
- 16 years: Kirsty Neill Gold 200m Breaststroke, Silver 100m Breaststroke
- 17+ years: Lucy Wheeler Gold 200m Freestyle; Emma Fields Silver 50m Butterfly; Niamh James Silver 200m Backstroke
- Top eight finishes: Molly Greatbatch, Dylan Davenport, Ella Greatbatch, Jakey Hayes, Kirsty Neill, Callum Cox, Callum Davis, Emma Fields, Jago Derrington, Lucy Wheeler, Niamh James

There were so many great performances, but special mention must go to Molly Greatbatch for reaching her first Regionals final in the 200m Breaststroke and to Dylan Davenport who was on superb form on the final weekend, securing two Bronze medals and a 4th place, swimming personal best times in all of seven of his races, breaking his own 12/13 year old BSSC records for 50m Butterfly and 100m Freestyle and taking the 50m Freestyle club record that had stood since 2008. Jago Derrington also broke his own Open club record for the 1500m Freestyle that he had set in March 2023 which had previously stood since 2005.

BRITISH AND ENGLISH SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

Many of our older swimmers have been chasing times for the British and English Summer meets. To qualify you have to be one of the top long course swimmers in your age group during a specified qualifying period (this year 10 March - 21 May). Twice a week in that time window a rankings list is published on the swimmingresults.org website, showing eligible swims by meet, sex, age group and event. Each week swimmers appear and disappear from the listings depending on their new times and rankings. Once the qualifying period has ended and all results have been uploaded to the Swim England rankings database, the top 24 ranked swimmers in each event are invited to the British Summer Championships in late July and the next 22 fastest swimmers are invited to the Swim England National Summer Meet in August (there are Swim Wales and Scotland Swimming events too).

Slight adjustments to the age groups and qualification rules occur each year making it tricky to write a single guide to what *typically* happens! Each of the meets have their own rules on age groups, so they differ across male and female swimmers and meet, and this year has seen some new rules brought in around qualification for 50m *form stroke* events (i.e. Breaststroke, Butterfly and Backstroke), where some younger age groups don't swim them at all and in most other age groups you can only qualify to swim a 50m form stroke event if you have qualified for the equivalent 100m event. If you're interested in finding out more the conditions for both meets can be found via our Events calendar.

The 2023 changes were a little confusing at first and some of our swimmers haven't quite made it onto the rankings list this year due to the new rulings on 50m events, but we have reached the date when the invites to the **British Summer Championships** have been sent out and we have the following swimmers competing:

Ella Greatbatch (15 years): 50m/100m/200m Breaststroke Kirsty Neill (16 years): 50m/100m/200m Breaststroke

Once the British Summer Championship invites were accepted, the next ranked swimmers were invited to a Home Nation meet, which for our swimmers is typically the Swim England National Summer Meet. Swimmers at the top of the English list can sometimes move to the British list as some competitors decline invites, but that has all just happened and the following swimmers are on the **Swim England National Summer Meet** list:

Dylan Davenport (14 years): 50m/100m Freestyle
Jago Derrington (17 years): 50m/100m/200m Backstroke

Niamh James (17 years /Over): 200m Backstroke Lucy Wheeler (17 years /Over): 100m Freestyle

Congratulations to all our swimmers who have qualified! Keep an eye on our social media channels, website and local newspaper for updates on their achievements.

WORLD MASTERS TOP 10 RANKINGS

In the first quarter of every year, Fédération Internationale de Natation (FINA), or World Aquatics as it is now known, publishes the **FINA Masters Top 10 Rankings** for the previous year. Three of our Masters squad had such a good year in 2022 that they feature in the World Top 10 fastest lists!

Alyson Fordham, competing in the 65-69 year old category, had a fantastic year achieving the 2nd fastest swim in the world in 2022 in the 50m and 200m Freestyle events (30.33 & 2:33.14), 3rd fastest for the 100m Freestyle (1:08.96) and 100m IM (1:20.35), 5th in the 50m Backstroke (38.20) and 7th for 400m Freestyle (5:20.40) all in the short course (25m pool) format. In the long course (50m pool) format, she was 2nd fastest in the 50m Freestyle (31.13), 4th in the 100m Freestyle (1:10.53) and 10th in the 400m Freestyle (5:47.04).





Elizabeth Bellinger (40-45yrs) and **Sally Winter** (60-65yrs) also got into the 2022 top 10 rankings for short course events, with Lizzie being the 5th fastest competitor in the world in the 100m Butterfly (1:07.45) and Sally the 7th fastest in the 200m Freestyle (2:27.99) and 10th in the 100m Freestyle (1:08.77).

Alyson's times from the 2022 season also propelled her into the **top 10 fastest swims of all time** for six events (four short course and two long course), with four of the times being new European records. By the end of 2022, she held both European records for 50m Freestyle and had the 4th fastest ever short course (25m) swim and the 7th long course (50m). Her other two European Records were in the SC 200m Freestyle and the SC 100m IM where she ranked 4th and 5th in the world all time rankings respectively. Finally, in the 100m Freestyle she has the 7th fastest SC and 9th fastest LC swims.

2023 MASTERS SUCCESSES

Our trio of fabulous Masters are building on the 2022 successes we've just shared with you and have kicked off 2023 with a bang. Masters Start 2023 in Record Breaking Style

Posted on: 1st February 2023

Two BSSC Masters swimmers recently travelled to Crawley for the Swim England South East Region Masters Open Long Course Competition and both were on record breaking form.

Alyson Fordham achieved a trio of golden freestyle events in the 65/69 year category, breaking her own 200m freestyle BRITISH record in a time of 2:39.54 and achieving South East Region (SER) meet best performances in the 50m freestyle (31.19) and 100m freestyle (1:10.99). In the shorter distances she was the 8th (100m) and 11th (50m) female across all age groups from 18+!

Sally Winter competed in the 60/64 year category and took gold in the 100m freestyle (1:11.35, 9th fastest female overall), gold and an East Region record in the 800m freestyle (1:46.24) and silver in the 50m backstroke (41.67).

2023 Masters Season is Golden

The 2023 Swim Wales Masters Long Course Championships were held the weekend after St David's Day at the Wales National Pool in Swansea, and regular BSSC competitor Lizzie Bellinger was in Golden form beating two Swim England East Region records that had stood since 2016. Competing in the 45-49yr old age group for the first time she took Gold in the 200m IM (2:42.50 East Region record), Gold in the 50m Fly (31.01) and Silver in the 100m Freestyle (1:05.20 East Region record). Lizzie unfortunately had to withdraw from the 100m Fly due to illness, but this was a great golden start to the 2023 season.

Bellinger is in golden record breaking form

Congratulations to BSSC Masters swimmer Elizabeth Bellinger who was recently in golden form at the Yorkshire Masters Long Course Open Meet. Lizzie took Gold in 100m Fly (1:09.13), 100m Back (1:18.73) and 50m Fly (30.10), securing three new East Region records in the 45/49 Yrs age group and finishing just one tenth of a second off the 100m Fly British age group record!

More records tumble at Masters Open

One week after winning three Gold medals and smashing three new long course (50m) East Region records, BSSC Masters swimmer Lizzie Bellinger continued her golden record breaking form at the Derbyshire Open Masters Championships. Three more Gold medals and three short course (25m) East Region 45-49yr age group records were secured in the 100m Fly (1:07.60), 200m IM (2:39.07) and 50m Fly (30.48).


