Head Coach - Jamie McLaughlin

BSSC CLUB RECORDS KEEP TUMBLING

We started January 2024 with our short course Hertfordshire County Championships and then moved into a mixture of long and short course open meets and some of our swimmers have been in record breaking form already.



At the Hertfordshire County Championships Brandon MacDonald-Williams took nearly 17 seconds off the 1500m Freestyle short course club record he had set back in November 2023 to take Silver in his age group. That 14-15 years record had previously stood since 2005.

season, Dylan Davenport broke the 100m Freestyle long course club record of 55.50 that had been held by Craig Ross since 2008.



You might have thought that having a birthday and moving into the Open Age group would slow Brandon down in his quest for records, but at the Norwich Easter meet he took seven seconds off Jago Derrington's 1500m Freestyle Open Age group long course club record that he had set in April 2023.

At that same Easter meet, Emma Fields was on flying form when she broke Amy Young's 2017 Open Age group long course 100m Butterfly record by 0.18 seconds.

Congrats to them all! We're looking forward to seeing what they achieve during the rest of this season. You can find our club records via the Swim Manager menu (website version only). They are split by short vs long course, gender, age group and event.



COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024 - WEEKEND ONE

Although January and February are long, cold boring months for most people, they are exciting ones for many BSSC swimmers as the Swim England Hertfordshire County Championships take place. This year, forty-three BSSC swimmers aged 11-29 qualified for 207 individual events and multiple relays.

Weekend one

The first weekend of the Championships kicked off in style with the 800m Freestyle. BSSC had four competitors up for the challenge of racing 32 lengths of a 25m swimming pool and they all performed superbly.

Brandon Macdonald-Williams snagged Silver in the Male/Open 16 year age group, whilst Miriam Moukdad took Bronze in the Female 17/Over age group with a 9 second improvement on her entry time.

Bobbie Macdonald-Williams was 6th in the Female 15 year age group and Jake Lloyd was 9th in the Male/Open 17/Over group.



Weekend two

BSSC swimmers were on sizzling form on weekend two, returning with twenty-eight age group medals, six Junior Championship awards and nine Championship awards.

The five 10 year olds swimming in the 10/11 year age group at their first County Championships all performed superbly, with Harrison Dodwell, Kenny Millsom and Yana Patel reaching age group finals and Olivia Hawker and Ellyse Harvey both swimming personal best times in their events.



COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024 - WEEKEND TWO

There were BSSC finalists in all of the younger age groups in the male 100m Breaststroke with Guy Spearman-Baines (12 yrs), Eddy Cheng (13 yrs) and Elliot Hall (14 yrs) all swimming personal best times to secure their places. Having taken 2 seconds off his PB in the heat, Eddy repeated that feat to take a further 1.3 seconds off in the final to finish 4th.

In the 200m Breaststroke, all five males finished top 8 and all six females top 9 in their age groups and six medals were won: Gold Molly Greatbatch (14 years) and Ella Greatbatch (15 years); Silver Robert Gor (16 years) & Niamh James (17/Over); Bronze Guy Spearman-Baines (12 yrs) & Lauren Gore (17/Over).







Another notable event was the 100m Butterfly where all five males reached finals, four of them got PBs and 4 medals were won: Gold Dylan Davenport (15 yrs); Silver Noah Conroy (12 yrs), Elliot Hall (13 yrs) & Jake Lloyd (17/Over).

Congratulations to our two club captains, Freya Hadnutt and Jakey Hayes, who were on great form in and out of the pool, supporting all the swimmers and both winning two bronze age group medals (Freya Hadnutt: 3rd 100m Backstroke & 100m Freestyle; Jakey Hayes: 3rd 100m & 200m Backstroke).

COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024 - WEEKEND THREE

Weekend three

Dylan Davenport added four Gold medals in the 15 year old age group to bring his overall total to eight (6 Gold, 2 Bronze), whilst Brandon added Gold in the 16 years 400m IM and Bronze in the 200m Freestyle to also boost his running total to eight medals (1 Gold, 4 Silver, 3 Bronze) ahead of the 1500m on the final weekend.

Freya Hadnutt recorded personal best times in the heats and finals of the 16 year 50m Backstroke to take Gold in a time that qualifies her for the East Region championships for the first time and also adding two more Bronze (50m & 200m Freestyle) to the two she won the weekend before.

Ella Greatbatch continued her domination of the 16 year old breaststroke events, adding the 50m Breaststroke Gold to complete the 50m/100m/200m trio. She also won Bronze in the 200m IM, keeping her defence of the top girl award alive.



Seventeen year old Emma Fields added the 50m Butterfly Gold to her 100m Butterfly Gold from weekend two and Laura Burgess secured both the 50m and 200m Freestyle Golds. Eleven year olds Jenson Richards and Noah Conroy were BSSC's youngest medallists, with Jenson taking Silver in the 50m Breaststroke (12 yrs age group) and Bronze in the 50m Butterfly and 400m Freestyle for Noah. The male 400m Freestyle saw a medal haul of one gold (Dylan Davenport), one silver (Brandon MacDonald-Williams) and two bronze (Noah Conroy and Elliot Hall).



COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024 - WEEKEND FOUR

BSSC brother sister duo Brandon & Bobbie MacDonald-Williams were in action in the 1500m freestyle event on the final weekend of the Hertfordshire County Championships. Both recorded superb personal best times, with Bobbie taking over a minute off her entry time to come 4th in the female 15 year age group and Brandon securing Silver in the 16 year age group, taking 17 seconds off the 14-15 year club record he set in November 2023.

The final day of 2024 Counties saw the clubs of Hertfordshire battling it out across eighteen relay events. Thirty-eight amazing BSSC swimmers created twenty-eight relay teams and took to the pool for some fast and furious action.

All six BSSC A relay teams in the youngest age group (13/Under) events finished in the top eight in the County (three 4th place finishes, one 5th and one 8th) and the female freestyle team of Millie Cass, Adeline Chan, Isabelle Earley and Lois Fields secured Bronze ahead of Royston by 0.01 seconds.



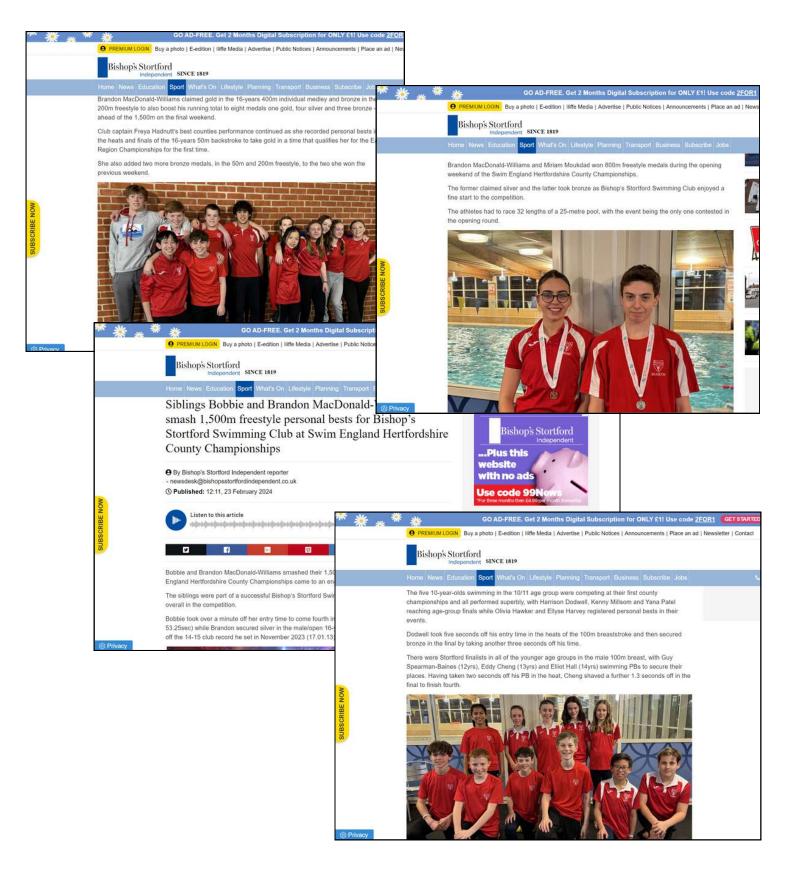
The mixed junior championship (15/Under) medley team of Elliot Hall, Molly Greatbatch, Dylan Davenport and Felice Chan held off Hatfield to secure Bronze, whilst three other junior championship teams finished in the top eight (securing 5th, 6th and 8th).

For the second year running, the female championship medley was one of the most exciting events. The 2023 defending champions Niamh James, Lauren Gore, Emma Fields and Laura Burgess were yet again equally matched on every leg by the Hatfield team and there was nothing between them until the final length when Laura Burgess touched for Gold.

Congratulations to all BSSC swimmers who took part in a very successful 2024 Counties. Just qualifying for and competing in an event at a County level is a special moment, but so many of the swimmers took it a step further with recording personal best times, reaching their first County final, getting their first medal, or securing their first Regional level qualifying times. Well done everyone!

BSSC & HARLOW PENGUINS REGIONAL QUALIFER

It was absolutely fantastic to welcome swimmers from ten clubs across Essex and Hertfordshire to Harlow Leisurezone on Saturday 23rd March for BSSC's very first open meet since 2019!

Jointly hosted with Harlow Penguins Swimming Club, our Regional Qualifier saw 45 BSSC swimmers aged from 9 to 23 take part in 145 swims. Our swimmers were on top form, with 99 out of 145 swims resulting in a top three place; 45 gold, 29 silver and 25 bronze medals were won on the day.

Twenty-one BSSC swimmers took home medals for every one of their races, including 9-year-old Poussins swimmer Daniel Cara, who was competing in his first meet with the Club.

Special mention goes to swimmers who secured gold medals in all of their races; Elliot Hall, Emma Fields, Freya Hadnutt, Harrison Dodwell, Joshua Green, Laura Burgess and Molly Greatbatch.

A big 'well done' to swimmers who achieved personal best times and top-three places in all of their events: Daniel Cara, Freya Hadnutt, Joshua Green, Laura Burgess, Linke Groenewald and Volodymyr Ignatiev.

RECIPES: POST-SWIMMING SNACKS

Looking for some ideas for post-swimming snacks? We'll be sharing recipes for healthy treats; the following recipes are courtesy of Swim England's Member News.

Protein Balls

Ingredients (makes eight balls):

- 2 tbsp honey
- 1 cup chopped dates
- 1 cup porridge oats
- 2 tbsp cocoa powder
- 3 tbsp instant coffee
- Packet of shredded coconut

Method

- 1. Soak dates in boiling water.
- 2. Add oats and cocoa powder into a blender and blitz until smooth.
- 3. Dissolve coffee in warm water.
- 4. Drain dates and add to the blender with coffee and honey and blitz.
- 5. Put the mixture into a bowl and shape them into balls.
- 6. Sprinkle with coconut.



Sultana flapjacks

Ingredients (makes 12 servings):

- 200g of butter or margarine
- 200g of sugar
- 200g of honey or golden syrup
- 400g of porridge oats
- 75g of sultanas

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C.
- 2. Butter a 20cm x 30cm cake tin.
- 3. Put the butter, sugar and honey in a saucepan and heat, stirring occasionally, until the butter has melted, and the sugar has dissolved.
- 4. Add the oats and sultanas and mix well.
- 5. Transfer the oat mix to the prepared tin and spread about 2cm thick.
- 6. Bake in the oven for 15 to 20 minutes, until lightly golden around the edges but soft in the middle.
- 7. Let cool in the tin, cut into squares.

REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024

The annual Swim England East Region Long Course Championships (aka Regionals) will be running from 20/21 April to mid-May and we will be sharing lots of updates via our Facebook/X/Instagram accounts and posting articles on our website and in the local newspaper. You can also watch events live via YouTube, so please do show your support for our 26 amazing qualifiers:



QUALIFYING FOR EVENTS

There are a few events coming up on our April-Aug calendar where swimmers will need to qualify for times and some will only be suitable for older swimmers. We've put a little guide to each of them below:

British Swimming Championships: this is the highest level national championships that British swimmers aim for and our swimmers have one more chance to qualify at Putteridge in March. The event runs in April and is always long course (50m).

Regionals: this is a long course (50m) championships run in May by Swim England East Region where clubs from the six Eastern counties of England compete together. Our swimmers are currently chasing qualification times that have just been published.

National Summer Meets: these are long course (50m) championships run in July and August by British Swimming and the Home Nation organisations, where the top ranked swimmers compete together. Our swimmers are currently chasing invitations and we have put an article on these events in this newsletter.

2024 BRITISH SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS AND HOME NATION SUMMER MEETS



Every summer the swimming season is rounded off with the British Summer Championships and the Home Nation Summer meets (England, Scotland, Wales). There are no qualifying times for these long course championships, instead the top-ranked swimmers in each event across specified age groupings are invited based on their long course swims at level 1 meets during the qualifying window, which in 2024 is Friday 8th March to Sunday 12th May. The fastest swimmers get invited to the British Summer Championships and then next set of swimmers get invited to the Home Nation Summer Meets (typically Swim England for our swimmers). If you decline an invite to the British Summer Championships you can't swim that event at any of the Home Nation meets. The invite list for all meets is published twice weekly throughout the qualifying window and can be found at the top of the swimmingresults.org website. Lots of changes happen to the invite list as swimmers attend level 1 meets, including Regionals, during the window so it can be a nervous wait for our top level swimmers. The implementation of the new selection rules across the meets are causing some errors in the invite list in some groupings, so don't get too excited just yet if you spot your name!

British Swimming (recently relaunched as Aquatics GB) and the home nations do like to tinker with the conditions and 2024 is yet another year where many changes have been made to the rules for all the meets. We've done our best to clearly describe them below and we're in the process of also updating our website guide.

2024 British Summer Championships - Ponds Forge, Sheffield from 20-26th July

The 2024 championships sees an increase in the number of swimmers offered the opportunity to compete where the 28 top-ranked swimmers in each event in each of the four younger age groupings will be invited. In the 18 years & over age group, 36 swimmers will be invited to attend with 12 places guaranteed for the transitioning 18 year old swimmers. The only exceptions to these numbers are the 800m and 1500m events, where the top 20 swimmers will be invited across all age groups.

All the usual events are part of the schedule, but the qualification rules are restrictive for the 50m events. Some of the key information updates are:

- Ages for males AND females 13/14 years, 15 years, 16 years, 17 years, 18 years and over
- There are no 50m events AT ALL (including freestyle) being run for 13/14 years swimmers
- As per last year, qualification for <u>all</u> 50m events is via the rankings for the equivalent 100m event in the 15, 16, 17 years age groups. Only the 18+ years age group can qualify directly for a 50m event via their times on the rankings database.

2024 BRITISH SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS AND HOME NATION SUMMER MEETS CONT'D



2024 Swim England National Summer Meet - Ponds Forge, 29th July - 3rd August

Running soon after the British Summer Championships is the Swim England National Summer Meet. The age groups for the Swim England National Summer Meet differ from the British Summer Championships and for 2024 are: 12/13 years, 14/15 years, 16 years, 17 years and 18+.

The National meet has also seen an increase in the number of swimmers being invited and the invites will go to:

Single age bands:

- 800m and 1500m Freestyle events: 20 swimmers
- All other events: 30 swimmers, including where in a double age band there is only an event for one age group

Double age bands and 18+:

- 800m and 1500m Freestyle events: 28 swimmers, with 10 places protected for the lowest age in each band (this includes 18+)
- All other events: 40 swimmers with 14 places protected for the lower age in each band

The Home Nation meets are also offering all the usual events, but the restriction on selection for the Swim England National Summer meet is even greater:

- There are no 50m events AT ALL (including freestyle) for 12/13/14 year old swimmers
- Qualification for <u>all</u> 50m events is via the rankings for the equivalent 100m event in the 15, 16, 17 years age groups. Only the 18+ years age group can qualify directly for a 50m event via their times on the rankings database.

PEANUTS LEAGUE - WHAT IS IT?!

You may have heard other parents talking about something called **Peanuts** and wondered what they were talking about?! Peanuts League is an annual interclub league competition run during May to July by the **Hertfordshire Swimming League**. For many of our swimmers, this will be the first team swimming event they have entered.

During the first part of each year BSSC coaches will select a team of swimmers to represent our club in The Peanuts League and the Competitions Team will be in touch via email with information on selections, dates and locations. The swimmers will be 9 to 12 (based on their age on the day of the final gala - normally around the end of June to early July) and they will compete in a series of age group individual events and relays over three separate galas (or rounds). The selected team may vary across each round due to swimmer availability.

The league is made up of 3 Divisions with around 12 teams per Division (the bigger clubs may send more than one team) and each Division competes over 3 Rounds:

- Round 1: teams from a Division are placed at random into the two different gala locations. Winning teams at each location receive 6 points, 2nd place 5 points, etc.
- **Round 2**: teams with odd placing (first, third etc) in Round 1 will meet teams with even placings from Round 1 in the Round 2 galas.
- Round 3: the results after Round 2 split the Division, with the top six competing in the Winners gala and the rest of the teams in the Consolation gala



At the end of Round 3, Pennants are awarded to the top six teams in each Division, the bottom two teams in Divisions 1 & 2 are demoted and the top two teams in Divisions 2 & 3 are promoted ready to do it all again in May-July the next year. We have competed in the top division of the league for many years and in both years post Covid have successfully defended our place in that division, finishing 6th in 2022 and 8th in 2023.

Sometimes as a parent it can seem a long way to go and a lot of time to invest when all your swimmer may do is "just one length in a single relay", but the Peanuts league is such a great opportunity to swim as part of a team in a sport which is mainly self-focused and the evenings are exciting and great fun.
