2024/25 SEASON UPDATE

EAST REGION LONG COURSE CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024

Twenty five BSSC swimmers recently competed against the top swimmers from the six eastern Counties of England – Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Essex, Hertfordshire, Norfolk and Suffolk – at the Swim England East Region Long Course (50m) Championships.

For many of the BSSC swimmers it was their first taste of a regional level competition and they stepped up to the additional challenge, securing many personal bests and breaking club records.

Top-three finishes

Four swimmers had outstanding performances and won medals in their age groups:

- 11/12 years: Summer Miller Bronze 200m Butterfly
- 14 years: Molly Greatbatch Silver 100m Breaststroke
- 15 years: Dylan Davenport Bronze 100m Butterfly
- 16 years: Ella Greatbatch Gold 200m Breaststroke

Highlights - too many to choose from!

There were so many other outstanding performances that it's hard to just pick a few highlights, but we've had an attempt!

Although eleven year old Noah Conroy did not make the 11/12 year old 50m butterfly final, his heat time of 35.64 broke the BSSC Age 10-11 long course record that had been held by Max McCusker since July 2010.

Brandon MacDonald-Williams improved his own Open age long course 1500m freestyle club record by nearly 6 seconds, swimming 17:40.62 to finish 6th overall.





Two BSSC swimmers featured in the **Regional Top Swimmer** awards. Molly Greatbatch gained personal best (PB) times in five of her seven swims and was joint ninth in the Top Female 14 years category.

Summer Miller, in her first ever Regional level competition, gained PBs in nine of her 11 swims and was joint 15th in the Top Female 11/12 years category.

Harrison Dodwell, BSSC's **youngest competitor at just 10 years old** on the day of the championships, competed in the 50m breaststroke in the 11/12 year old category (age is defined by 31st Dec 2024). He couldn't better the time he set in the same pool at Easter, but came very close and was the 5th fastest (nearly) 11 year old, showing great promise for the 11/12 age group next year.

The other swimmers in the 11/12 year age group all achieved **personal bests in their events**: Elspeth Lowe (38.56 50m Backstroke), Guy Spearman-Baines (43.34 50m Breaststroke, 1:36.02 100m Breaststroke) and Jenson Richards (43.95 50m Breaststroke).

After Round One, BSSC finished eighth in the league - putting us in a strong position going into Round Two in Hitchin in June.

PEANUTS LEAGUE - WHAT IS IT?!

Interested in finding out more about **Peanuts**? Peanuts League is an annual interclub league competition run during May to July by the **Hertfordshire Swimming League**. For many of our swimmers, this will be the first team swimming event they have entered.

During the first part of each year BSSC coaches will select a team of swimmers to represent our club in The Peanuts League and the Competitions Team will be in touch via email with information on selections, dates and locations. The swimmers will be 9 to 12 (based on their age on the day of the final gala - normally around the end of June to early July) and they will compete in a series of age group individual events and relays over three separate galas (or rounds). The selected team may vary across each round due to swimmer availability.

The league is made up of 3 Divisions with around 12 teams per Division (the bigger clubs may send more than one team) and each Division competes over 3 Rounds:

- **Round 1**: teams from a Division are placed at random into the two different gala locations. Winning teams at each location receive 6 points, 2nd place 5 points, etc.
- **Round 2**: teams with odd placing (first, third etc) in Round 1 will meet teams with even placings from Round 1 in the Round 2 galas.
- Round 3: the results after Round 2 split the Division, with the top six competing in the Winners gala and the rest of the teams in the Consolation gala



At the end of Round 3, Pennants are awarded to the top six teams in each Division, the bottom two teams in Divisions 1 & 2 are demoted and the top two teams in Divisions 2 & 3 are promoted ready to do it all again in May-July the next year. We have competed in the top division of the league for many years and in both years post Covid have successfully defended our place in that division, finishing 6th in 2022 and 8th in 2023.

Sometimes as a parent it can seem a long way to go and a lot of time to invest when all your swimmer may do is "just one length in a single relay", but the Peanuts league is such a great opportunity to swim as part of a team in a sport which is mainly self-focused and the evenings are exciting and great fun.

2024 AQUATICS GB SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS



The Aquatics GB Summer Championships (previously known as the British Summer Championships) sees the top-ranked swimmers in Britain race against each other to be crowned British summer champion. Qualifying swims have to happen at Level 1 (Long Course) meets in a defined March-May window and this year two current BSSC swimmers and two recent BSSC Alumni were fast enough to receive invites to compete. The 2024 event was held in the Ponds Forge International Pool in Sheffield from 20-26th July.

Dylan Davenport overcame an injury during the season and was invited to compete in the 15 year age group in the 50m and 100m freestyle. He had a great swim and came 10th in the 50m freestyle final in a time of 25.55 seconds, having achieved a personal best time of 25.36 to secure his place in the top ten in Britain. He also came 15th in the 100m Freestyle in a time 55.32 just outside his PB.





Ella Greatbatch competed in 16 year age group and was 13th in the 200m Breaststroke in a time very close to her season's best.

BSSC alumni Kirsty Neill who moved to Millfield School at the start of this season, also had a successful championships, securing a personal best time to come 5th in a closely matched 17 year age group 200m Breaststroke final where bronze to 6th was decided by 0.22 seconds. She also was 10th in the 100m Breaststroke and 20th in the 50m Breaststroke.

Another recent BSSC alumni Callum Cox, who moved to Mount Kelly School at the end of last season, was also invited to the championships and finished 27th in an extremely competitive 18 Yrs and over 50m Butterfly event.

Massive congratulations to all past and present BSSC swimmers who were invited to compete at this prestigious summer event and thanks to Headcoach Jamie for his fantastic support throughout both summer events.

2024 SWIM ENGLAND NATIONAL SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIPS



Running soon after the Aquatics GB Summer Championships is the Swim England National Summer Meet, where the next batch of fastest swimmers are invited to compete. Invites are again based on qualifying swims from Level 1 (Long Course) meets in a defined March-May window and this year nine current BSSC swimmers were fast enough to receive invites to compete.



Brandon MacDonald-Williams kicked off the BSSC campaign in great style, finishing 9th in the 16yrs 1500m freestyle and shaving ten seconds off his own BSSC club record in the process (17:30.05)! A few days later he was back in record breaking time, this time taking nearly 4 seconds off his 800m freestyle record to finish 15th in his age group (9:06.33).

Ella Greatbatch was our top finisher overall, taking Gold in the 50m breaststroke final (33.89) and Silver in the 100m breaststroke final where she also broke her own club record with a time of 1:14.71.

Fourteen year old Molly Greatbatch was our youngest competitor and performed superbly at her first National level event, finishing 14th in the 14/15yrs 200m breaststroke (5th fastest 14 year old) and 29th in the 100m breaststroke.

Dylan Davenport (15yrs), Emma Fields (18/Over) and Lucy Wheeler (18/Over) all had great swims to reach finals in their age groups. Dylan was 7th in the 50m butterfly final and 22nd in the 100m butterfly; Emma was 10th in the 50m butterfly final and 17th in the 100m butterfly; whilst Lucy was 6th in the 100m freestyle final.



Congratulations also go to Laura Burgess (18/Over) who was 11th in the 50m freestyle, Jakey Hayes (17yrs) 18th in the 200m backstroke and Lauren Gore (18/Over) 29th in the 50m breaststroke.









MASTERS COMPETITIONS & NEWS

Triple Gold for BSSC Masters

Two BSSC Masters were in action at the 2024 Derbyshire Open Long Course Masters Championships.

Lizzie Bellinger (45/49 Yrs Age Group) had a one-two of amazing swims, swimming a 1:10.40 100m Butterfly and a 2:44.53 200m IM with no more than ten minutes rest between the two, earning herself two golds in the process.

Assistant head coach Joe Collins (25/29 Yrs Age Group) performed a true "splash & dash" going to swim the 50m Breaststroke and Freestyle, getting Gold in the breaststroke with 34.14 and just missing out on a podium finish in the freestyle, coming in 4th.



Golden time at British Masters Championships

BSSC Masters swimmers Lizzie Bellinger and Alyson Fordham had outstanding performances at the British Masters Championships, bringing home five gold and three silver medals and a new East Region records.

Lizzie (45-49 yrs), the current age group British record holder, obliterated the field in the 100m Fly winning nearly 14 seconds ahead of her closest rival (1:10.36) and broke the East Region record taking silver in the 200m IM (2:41.73). She also won Gold in the 50m Fly (30.67 seconds).

Alyson Fordham (65-69 yrs), already the age group European Record holder in both the 50 and 100m Freestyle, easily won gold in both events (50m 30.62 & 100m 1:10.51) and added gold in the 100m Backstroke (1:24.15, new East Region record) and silver in both the 50m Backstroke (39.30) and 50m Breaststroke (42.79) to her haul.

Congratulations to them both on their achievements that continue to inspire our younger swimmers.

MASTERS COMPETITIONS & NEWS

BSSC Masters on top of the world in 2023!

The World Aquatics Masters rankings for 2023 were published in April and two BSSC Masters had such a great year that they feature in the World Aquatics Top 10 lists of fastest swimmers!

Sixty eight year old Alyson Fordham had an amazing 2023, becoming the fastest woman in the WORLD in her 65-69 year age group in the short course (25 pool) 50m & 100m Freestyle, the 100m & 200m Backstroke and the 100m IM. She showed her versatility by also being the 4th fastest in the 50m Backstroke, 5th in the 200m Freestyle and 50m Breaststroke and 7th in the 100m Breaststroke. In the long course (50m pool) format, she again topped the world rankings in the 50m Freestyle, was 3rd fastest in the 100m Freestyle, 4th in the 50m Breaststroke, 5th in the 200m Freestyle and 7th in the 50m Backstroke.

Lizzie Bellinger (45-49yrs) also got into the 2023 world top 10 rankings for both short course (SC) and long course (LC) events, being the 3rd fastest competitor in the world in the SC and LC 100m Butterfly, 6th in the SC and LC 50m Butterfly and the SC 200m IM, 7th in the SC 400m IM and 9th in the LC 200m IM.

BSSC Masters Shine at Hertfordshire Championships

Eight BSSC Masters swimmers won medals in every event they entered at the Swim England Hertfordshire Masters Championships, bringing home an amazing 22 individual medals.

The relay teams were equally successful, resulting in four Gold and one Silver finishes.

Beating the Best in Europe

Two BSSC Masters recently represented Team GB at the European Aquatics Masters Championships in Belgrade. Both Alyson Fordham (65-69 yrs) and Lizzie Bellinger (45-59 yrs) were on superb form across multiple events.

Lizzie, the current Aquatics GB record holder in the 100m Fly, was in action across four events and secured an impressive three Silver medals and one Bronze medal, setting Swim England East Region records in both the 200m and 400m Individual Medleys.

Alyson, the European Record holder in the 50m and 100m Freestyle, kicked off her campaign with a Silver in the 50m Breaststroke, and quickly followed that up with two superb Gold medals and European Masters Championship Records in the 50m and 100m Freestyle.





Fundraising for Stortford at the Serpentine



RECIPES: POST-SWIMMING SNACKS

Looking for some ideas for post-swimming snacks? We'll be sharing recipes for healthy treats; the following recipes are courtesy of Swim England's Member News.

Super Food Smoothies

Ingredients (for four servings):

- 1/2 cup blueberries
- 1/2 cup raspberries
- 1 large banana
- 1/4 cup walnuts
- 1/2 peaches
- 1 cup light coconut milk
- 1 large handful of spinach
- Water and ice as needed



Method

- 1. Add all ingredients to your blender. If using frozen fruit, add enough water to blend. If using fresh fruit, add enough water to blend as well as ice to make cold.
- 2. Process until smooth.
- 3. Garnish with additional berries.



Banana muffins

Ingredients (makes 10 muffins):

- 50g butter
- 75g brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 225g wholemeal flour
- 2 mashed bananas
- Pinch of salt
- 1 tablespoon of baking powder
- 1 tablespoon of vanilla essence
- 5 tablespoons of milk

Method

- 1. Combine all ingredients in a large bowl.
- 2. Spoon into 10 non-stick bun tins.
- 3. Bake at approximately 190C for approximately 20 minutes.

Temperatures soar while times and records tumble

Eight BSSC swimmers, assistant head coach Joe Collins and volunteer Team Managers Kat Gore, Lorraine Hayes and Tony Hadnutt recently headed south to the K2 50m pool in Crawley for **Romford Town Swimming Club's Last Chance National Qualifier Meet**.

The clue was most definitely in the title, as this long course meet was held on the final weekend within the qualifying window for the Aquatics GB and Swim England Summer Meets. Only the top swimmers in the country get invited to the National Summer Meets and this open meet was one of only four running in England offering final qualification chances so the pressure was high, as were the temperatures!

Despite sweltering poolside, the swimmers performed superbly in the water, with eight personal bests and many other seasons bests being recorded. **Twelve medals were secured** (6 Gold, 3 Silver, 3 Bronze) and three swimmers increased the chance of them being invited to the national summer meets. Emma Fields broke her own open age group **100m butterfly club record**, dropping her time to 1:04.18, **Jakey Hayes got a personal best** in the 200m backstroke (2:15.13) and Lauren Gore lowered her seasons best 50m breaststroke time (35.38). Laura Burgess and Emma Fields came close to their 50m freestyle and butterfly times that had already put them on the potential invite list, but did not improve them.


Speeding tickets issues at Watford Development Meet
